**Time expressions:** now, right now, at the moment, today, at present, tonight, this week, these days, next week, later

**Stative verbs** are not often used in the continuous form. Some common stative verbs are: *believe, belong, cost, have, hear, imagine, like, look, mind, need, own, prefer, see, seem, smell, taste, think, understand, want, weigh.* 

Some stative verbs like *think, see, look* and *have* can be used in Present Continuous, but this changes their meaning.
