1. Tech school

Where: in the USA

What do students do: Students study the subjects they want. They can listen to music with headphones while they work. Students can sit at a desk, on a sofa or on the floor!

2. Monsters University

4. Hogwarts


Where: in a castle in Scotland

Interesting fact: Students take a train and a boat to get to school. It's faster than going by car!






